Discussion on the importance of a strategic approach
to the Australian science system

Professor Ian Chubb was appointed to the position of Australia's Chief Scientist in 2011. Prior to this appointment Professor Chubb was Vice-Chancellor of the Australian National University and Flinders University and Senior Deputy Vice-Chancellor of Monash University and the University of Wollongong. He has been Chair of the Higher Education Council and Committee for Quality Assurance in Higher Education and Training.

Professor Chubb commenced his academic career as a lecturer at the Flinders University School of Medicine with research interest in neuroscience.

In 1999 Professor Chubb was made an Officer of the Order of Australia (AO), in 2006 he was made a Companion (AC) in the order and in 2000 he was awarded a Doctor of Science from Flinders University. He was made the ACT's Australian of the Year in 2011 for his contribution to higher education.
