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Description of the study

This study is part of a project entitled "The Impact of audience feedback in modifying negative interpretation bias and reducing state anxiety in socially anxious individuals" and aims to investigate whether using audience feedback will reduce the two cognitive biases, namely negative self-imagery and interpretation bias and result in improvements in the effects of combined video feedback and audience feedback on self-perception of performance and state anxiety pertaining to a social performance. Purpose of the study

This project aims to find out the impact of using combined audio feedback and video feedback on negative interpretation bias and state anxiety pertaining to a speech performance.

What will I be asked to do?

You are invited to attend an in-person session where you will be asked to 1) undertake cognitive assessment tasks by viewing a series of words on a computer and pressing a button as quick as you can, 2) perform two 3-minute talks before completing questionnaires in relation to your feelings and experiences relating to the speech you give. You will present your talk in front of a live audience and your talk will be recorded by video in order to be evaluated. The questionnaires and tasks will take around 75mins.



You will receive \$30 for your time. Information gained from the study will remain confidential and anonymous. Your participation is completely voluntary.

What benefit will I gain from being involved in this study?

By participating in the study, you may gain additional insight into psychological research. The information you provide during this study may contribute to information that is of value in further developing an understanding of effective interventions for social anxiety.

Will I be identifiable by being involved in this study?

No identifying information will need to be provided on any of the questionnaires and the information provided by you will be treated in the strictest of confidence. Consent forms will be kept separately from the data collected. None of the information provided by you will be individually identifiable in the resulting thesis or any other publication. All data collected is assigned a code number to ensure anonymity. The video recording of your speeches will be deleted upon completion of your participation. All personal correspondence (e.g., emails) will be deleted upon completion of the study.

Are there any risks or discomforts if I am involved?

We anticipate few risks from your involvement in this study. However, a speech task may elicit anxiety in some participants, and some of the questions that are asked (e.g., asking your feelings and experiences) may be sensitive to you. In addition, the cognitive tasks may be uncomfortable for some people. You are reminded that you have the right to require a rest, or refuse to answer any questions or participate in any tasks and you are free to withdraw your participation at any time without reason or consequence.
